This summer, your middle-schooler can enjoy an engaging book and sharpen critical reading and discussion skills while also building an understanding of why there's a historic push for racial justice right now.

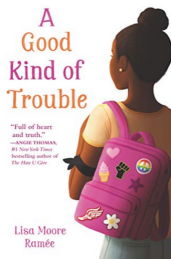

Your middle-schooler will:

- Receive strategies and guidance for reading with purpose
- Complete weekly reading goals for the selected book and creative, critical thinking activities
- Meet weekly (45 - 60 minutes) in a small group discussion of no more than 6 students for teacher-guided review and discussions
- Write, draw, talk, chat on Meemli* to share thoughts and findings
- Build confidence in delving into and discussing important topics in a safe learning space

*Meemli provides a safe, private online learning space for students where no personal information is collected or shared.
